

**MINUTES

**Close Out of
St. Vincent
De Paul**

The City Council of the City of Poplar Bluff, Missouri, conducted a public hearing to discuss the past performance by the City in carrying out the City's Community Development Block Grant for the relocation and rehabilitation of the St. Vincent de Paul facility.

Ms. Camille Donnell of the Ozark Foothills Regional Planning Commission, 3019 Fair Street, Poplar Bluff, Missouri, appeared before the Council. She stated this public hearing is a requirement to close out this grant project. She stated these grant funds paid for a new roof and relocation of the St. Vincent de Paul facility which totaled an amount of \$292,300. She stated there were also fees for the property, architectural services and grant administration.

There being no further business to come before this public hearing of the City Council, motion was made by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Councilman Tinsley and carried that this public hearing be adjourned.
